Understanding

Understand the effect that one point perspective has on the observer's view of the image.	
Look at, and talk about shape and pattern within their own environment applying terms correctly.	
• Look at, and talk about drawings from other periods and cultures – Renaissance (Filippo Brunelleschi (1377 – 1446),	
Michaelangelo, Leonardo vs Picasso or Escher – tricks of perspective).	2C
Understand that the relationship between, shape, scale and position is important.
