Learning Module: Spring Term 1 / Puzzle 3 Year 2 – Dreams and Goals



Pupil outcomes as a result of this module -

Children will learn will learn about how to overcome obstacles to achieve their dreams and goals and manage feelings of frustration. They will learn how to break a goal down into achievable steps.

Knowledge

- o I can choose a realistic goal and think about how to achieve it.
- o I carry on trying (persevering) even when I find things difficult.
- I can recognise who I work well with and who it is more difficult for me to work with.
- o I can work well in a group.
- o I can tell you some ways I worked well with my group.

Skills

- o I can tell you things I have achieved and say how that makes me feel.
- o I can tell you some of my strengths as a learner.
- o I can tell you how working with other people helps me learn.
- I can work with others in a group to solve problems.
- o I can tell you how I felt about working in my group.
- o I can tell you how being part of a successful group feels and I can store these feelings in my internal treasure chest.

Understanding

- o I know how to share success with other people.
- I can explain how I played my part in a group and the parts other people played to create an end product.
- o I can explain how it felt to be part of a group and can identify a range of feelings about group work.

End of Year/Key Stage Objectives
